<b>Choose and answer 2 (two) questions from the following:</b>	
<p><b>Question 1:</b> A) Define "criminal liability" under Maltese law and explain the conditions that must be present for criminal liability to arise. Support your answer with relevant case law and legal principles.  B) Discuss the concept of "mens rea" (guilty mind) and "actus reus" (guilty act) as they relate to establishing criminal liability in Maltese law.</p> <p><b>Question 2:</b> Analyse the objectives of punishment in Maltese criminal law. Discuss the main types of punishments available and the principles that guide sentencing decisions.</p> <p><b>Question 3:</b> Analyse the elements required to establish criminal negligence under Maltese law. How does the prosecution prove these elements in a court of law?</p> <p><b>Question 4:</b> A) Describe the main defences available in Maltese criminal law and discuss under what circumstances they can be successfully raised. Include self-defence, provocation, necessity, and any others recognized under Maltese law.  B) Discuss the role of intoxication as a defence in criminal cases in Malta. Under what conditions, if any, can intoxication serve as a valid defence?</p>
